

Section 1—Listening Comprehension—**SCRIPT**

In this section of the test, you will have an opportunity to demonstrate your ability to understand conversations and talks in English. There are two parts to this section. Answer all the questions on the basis of what is stated or implied by the speakers you hear. Do not take notes or write in your test book at any time.

Part A – Directions: In Part A you will hear short conversations between two people. After each conversation you will hear a question about the conversation. The conversation and questions will not be repeated. After you hear a question, read the 4 possible answers in your test book and choose the best answer. Then, on your answer sheet, find the number of the question and fill in the space that corresponds to the letter of the answer you have chosen. *Now, read the example in your testbook. (1 min)*

(Question) What is the man saying about their results in the competition?

(woman) It's not too late to go, is it?
(Question) What does the woman think?

8. (man) Why are you looking so worried?
(woman) I can't find my wallet. I hope it wasn't stolen.
(Question) What does the woman fear?

9. (woman) That sure was a loud meeting.
(man) Everyone seemed to have something to say.
(Question) What are they saying about the meeting?
10. (man) I need to take this book back to the library right away.
(woman) But the book isn't due for a week!
(Question) When should the book be returned to the library?
11. (man) I can't believe that you made that bracelet.
(woman) It's really not too hard. It just takes a lot of time.
(Question) What is the woman saying about the bracelet?
12. (man) Did it cost very much to stay overnight at the hotel?
(woman) More than I wanted to pay.
(Question) What is the woman saying about the cost of the hotel?
13. (woman) The checks aren't in my purse.
(man) Why don't you look in your suitcase?
(Question) Where does the man think the woman left her checks?
14. (man) I heard that Mr. Milton has a new position now.
(woman) He was appointed dean of the college last month.
(Question) What is the woman saying about Mr. Milton?
15. (man) Was Roger able to pay his tuition fee this semester?
(woman) He scarcely had enough money to pay the fee.
(Question) What does the woman say about Roger?
16. (woman) Eric twisted his ankle playing basketball.
(man) Can he walk on his ankle now?
(Question) What does the man want to know?
17. (woman) We are unable to accept your housing application because it's past the Deadline.
(man) But where am I suppose to stay?
(Question) What is the man's problem?
18. (man) Have you been working on your biology homework?
(woman) What homework is that?
(Question) Why is the woman surprised?
19. (woman) Have you read the article Stan wrote for the school newspaper?
(man) Yes, I have. I typed it for him.
(Question) What is the man saying about Stan's article for the newspaper?

20. (woman) These problems are really difficult!
(man) Don't give up. Keep working on them.
(Question) What does the man say the woman should do?
21. (man) Did you buy the perfume that you liked so much?
(woman) No, I only had ten dollars with me.
(Question) What is the woman's problem?
